# Co-op Enterprises Build a Better World

he statistics are staggering. In the United States, cooperatives contribute annual sales of more than \$652 billion and generate 2 million jobs according to the National Cooperative Business Association. Cooperatives are businesses that operate for the benefit of their member-owners. are governed by democratic principles, and contribute to socio-economic development in fields ranging from banking and insurance to utilities and grocery. More than a billion people count themselves as cooperative members around the globe.

In recognition of the tremendous impact this model makes worldwide, the United Nations has designated 2012 as "The International Year of Cooperatives." International Years are declared annually by the U.N. on one or several topics in an effort to draw attention to and encourage action on major issues. The year 2005 marked the International Year of Microcredit followed by Bangladeshi economist Mohammad Yunus receiving the Nobel Peace Prize in 2006 for his work in this area

While the initiative focuses on the cooperative as a worldwide enterprise, each remains a local business at its core. "Cooperatives serve a need that is not being met and are often recognized as local

innovators and trend setters. says Adam Schwartz, vice president of public affairs and member services for the National Cooperative Business Association. "With this designation, we hope to raise the profile of cooperatives, help people get to know them better and make it easier to do business with them.

After the declaration, Pauline Green, board president of the International Cooperative Alliance, remarked, "The cooperative model is a better choice and offers the basis for a more

sustainable way to do business when compared to traditional capitalist models now under scrutiny. What sets this model apart from others is that all

cooperatives, whether they are small farmers or large consumer-owned entities, share the values of democracy, solidarity, equality, self-help, and selfresponsibility, creating businesses that serve the greater good as opposed to maximizing profit for the very few." There is also a resolution pending in the U.S. Senate designating 2012 as

"The International Year of Cooperatives" and both Minnesota senators have joined as co-sponsors of this legislation.

With the slogan "Cooperative Enterprises Build a Better World," this initiative will be officially launched at the United Nations New York headquarters in October. Also during that month, the National Cooperative Business Association will take its annual conference on the road for the first time and hold their meetings in Minneapolis, Oct. 4-7.

In the words of UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon, "Cooperatives are a reminder to the international community that it is possible to pursue both economic vitality and social responsibility." Watch for more information on this initiative in future issues of the Mix.
