For example, MPR reporter and ArtHounds Producer Chris Roberts and Star Tribune theatre critic Graydon Royce met with the group at the MPR Studios in May.

"American Idiot pushes the boundaries and makes you think," wrote Critical View student Lily Hammer from Breck High School in Golden Valley. "I do know that I walked into the theatre ready to be wowed, endured an incredible artistic experience, and walked out yearning to see it all over again." Students who might not otherwise have the opportunity to attend live stage productions also receive study guides and the same press kits as the professional media to help them prepare for the show. They also attend non-Broadway productions including All Is Calm: The Christmas Truce of 1914 and High starring Kathleen Turner.

Tomorrow, Thursday, June 7, at 7:30 pm in the New Century Theatre, the fourpart *Talk-It Hennepin* series wraps up with a


compelling conversation, *Owning Public Space - The Power of Place Identity*, about creating and managing a shared,

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












Critical View Wraps Up Eighth Successful Year

Three fascinating speakers will bring broad experience and innovative ideas to the table: Cultural geographer and MacArthur Fellowship recipient Don Mitchell will talk about contested urban spaces; Chancee Martorell, founder and director of Thai Community Development Center and East Hollywood's Thai Town, will share her street-wise work within that multi-cultural space and nationally-recognized, Saint Paul-based artist Seitu Jones will draw on theory and practice from in his work in multiple cities around the country.

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"The thing that is different about this workshop is that we are looking at human interaction on the street level," says Tom Borrup, project, manager of *Plan-It Hennepin*. "We will look for different ways to talk about Hennepin as a shared cultural experience."

During the previous *Talk-It* workshop on May 12th at FAIR School Downtown, 40 participants walked up and down Hennepin Avenue, applying British urbanist and project guest Charles Landry's idea of "yes" and "no" spaces. They took pictures of a handful of "no" spaces, and explained to the group their vision of how to turn this space into a welcoming, engaging "yes" space. Led by a mixture of local artists and designers, each group generated many ideas as they reimagined Minneapolis' oldest street.

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

Q&A with Christopher Kale Jones, Under the Streetlamp Tenor and Former Jersey Boys Star

We recently chatted with him about this hot new singing group.

What led you to create Under the Streetlamp?

was in Chicago after I finished my run with *Jersey Boys* and started performing on off nights with Michael Cunio, Michael Ingersoll and bonn Wiley, other members of the Chicago cast. Forming the group was very organic- once the four of us started performing together we really enjoyed how much the audience responded and began thinking about officially forming a singing group and taking off our full-time acting hats. I don't remember exactly when our debut performance as Under the Streetlamp was, but it was in early spring 2010 in Chicago.

What can the audience expect to see during the show?

We sing music from what I like to call the "radio music songbook." There are songs you remember, like nostalgic hits from The Beach Boys, The Beatles and the Four Seasons- from doo-wop and Motown to old-time rock 'n' roll hits. We also tell stories, have fun and, of course, rip on each other. We hope audience members come away thinking that we're just four ordinary guys you'd like to have over to your house for dinner. We take the music very seriously, but we don't take ourselves very seriously at all!

Do you have a favorite song in the show?

One of my favorites is "Since I Fell For You," a jazz and pop standard that was made famous by Lenny Welch in 1963. I'll admit I didn't know much about the song at first, but I found the melody so lush and almost heart-breaking. I've also found that the more you sing these songs, the more you appreciate certain aspects of all of them, depending on the show that night.

You performed as Frankie Valli in the debut of *Jersey Boys* in Minneapolis at the Orpheum Theatre in April 2008. What are your memories of the Twin Cities?

It was spring, so the first thing I remember was how walkable the city was- great restaurants around the theatre and everyone we met was so friendly. But my favorite memory is definitely having the opportunity to perform at the Orpheum every night. I was in awe of the grandeur of that theatre and the stories it has told. It was truly an honor to be a part of the Orpheum's tradition and history.
