On behalf of Hennepin Theatre Trust, welcome to the North American premiere of *The 101 Dalmatians Musical* at the Orpheum Theatre. This grand historic theatre, first known as the Hennepin, originally opened to present live vaudeville acts. The best seats in the house sold for 47 cents and children's tickets were nine cents.

In the mid-1990s after decades of neglect, the Orpheum was renovated and revived. The theatre was redone in deep Victorian colors, the art deco marquee was restored and

reinstalled and the stage was extended almost 20 feet in order to accommodate the most elaborate new Broadway productions. If you look up at the mural on the ceiling above the stage, you will see artwork that was added after the discovery of a black and white photo of the original theatre.

The Orpheum is an integral part of the Hennepin Theatre District and has been at the center of the revival of Hennepin Avenue. From popular musical acts at the State Theatre to new works at the Pantages to the much anticipated new home for dance at the Shubert Theatre set to reopen in 2012, there is a show for everyone in downtown Minneapolis.

This production of 101 Dalmatians is based on the original 1957 novel by Dodie Smith and features 15 adult Dalmatians, many of which were rescued from animal shelters around the country. Rescue and shelter animals are especially important to me as a Board Member of the Animal Humane Society. These companion animals bring an incredible amount of unconditional love to the lives of so many people and I am thrilled that many rescue dogs are part of this production.

Thank you for joining us today at the Orpheum Theatre. I am honored to represent this historic treasure, which continues to be such a vital part of our downtown. Enjoy the show!
